Today I am sharing a quick tutorial that demonstrates some really effective ways to dress up your chipboard.



So first – how to cover chipboard with paper:

1. I glue my heart, as well as a chipboard frame, onto my pattern paper. Double sided tape can work too.
2. I cut out the design with a craft knife, and then file down the edges with a sanding tool.

This is the result. Love it! Papering over chipboard is such a fun way to dress it up!



Next—covering Chipboard with embossing powder:

I decide to use white embossing powder for that pretty heart - I love the gloss finish that heat embossing gives to your chipboard!

1. Ink your chipboard with an 'embossing ink pad'
2. Generously pour embossing powder over your chipboard.
3. lift out your chipboard and shake/tap a little.
4. Scoop up your leftover powder and pop it back in the jar for next time.
5. Use a heat tool to heat your embossing powder – hold it about 5cm away and keep it moving over the chipboard until the embossing powder sets.



Lastly – inking chipboard:

For darker colours or grungy work you can apply your ink pad directly to the chipboard with a patting motion. Or you can apply it with a sponge block /dauber/blending tool for lighter coverage.

For pale /shabby work or lighter colours- emboss your chipboard with white embossing powder first then apply your favourite juicy inks.
